SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptism - First Saturday of the month in English at 1:00 pm. Second Saturday of the month in Spanish at 1:00 PM. Parents must meet with the pastor prior to the Baptism. Parents and Godparents are required to attend Baptismal instruction. Instruction is held same day as Baptism, prior to ceremony.

Reconciliation - 4:00 PM before the Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

Marriage - Couples are required to make arrangements one year to six months prior to the date of marriage. One party must be a registered and active member of this parish. Participation in Pre-marriage Program is required. Couple must meet with the pastor prior to any arrangements being made.

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SEPTEMBER 6, 2015

First Reading: Isaiah 35:4-7a

Isaiah tells the people to be strong and unafraid. God will save his people, and the blind will see, the deaf will hear, and the lame will walk. Streams will come forth in the desert, the sandy ground will become springs of water.

Second Reading: James 2:1-5

James encourages the people to never show favoritism. He discusses an usher who escorted a rich man to the best seat, while ignoring a poor man. God chose poor people to be rich in faith, so we should never judge people by their riches.

Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

Some people brought a deaf man who could not speak to Jesus and begged him to lay his hand on the man. Jesus opened the man's ears and cured his speech impediment. He ordered the people not to tell anyone, but they were too amazed to keep this to themselves.

SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears, and spitting, touched his tongue, then he looked up to heaven and groaned and said to him 'Ephphatha' that is 'Be opened.' And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly...They were exceedingly astonished and they said 'He has done all things well.'"

We can make a list of the miracles of Jesus. Some were cures from a distance, some taking one by the hand, some by a spoken word.

Today we find touch, saliva, a groan and a word. We do not learn how the man reacted, but the people, ordered told to remain quiet, told the story.

Each one of us, at our baptism, found the minister touching our ears and tongue and told; As Jesus made the deaf to hear and dumb to speak, so may He open your ears to hear His word and your mouth to proclaim His praise.' We were told that we, in the words of Pope Francis, are to be 'Missionary Disciples.' We have encountered Christ, turned to Him, accepted His teaching, and now are sent to live out that baptismal mandate. Though the man who was cured was anonymous, we are to tell others that He has done all things well.
